
JOB DESCRIPTION

Nutrition Services (Non-Clinical) Meal Program Assistant – Nutrition Center

Essential functions, as defined under the Americans with Disabilities Act, include the responsibilities, knowledge, skills, and other characteristics listed below. This list of responsibilities is ILLUSTRATIVE ONLY and is not a comprehensive listing of all functions and tasks performed by positions in this class. To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. Other duties may be assigned. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

The duties of the Nutrition Services Staff include, but are not limited to:

- Answers directly to the Nutrition Services Director, which may be the specified member or representative of Commissioners Court and the Nutrition Center Meal Program Manager.
- Engage with the clients on a daily basis.
- Will work closely and as directed with DETCOG representatives.
- May be required to submit needed reports to DETCOG and County Departments.
- Answers and operates the center phone systems and routes callers or provides information.
- Receives the public and answers questions; responds to inquiries from employees, citizens and others. Refers, when necessary, to appropriate persons.
- Operates and is familiar with current nutrition center equipment.
- Prepares and distributes prepared meals, as needed.
- Works with the maintenance department daily cleaning and maintaining safety of the nutrition center food prep area, dining room and equipment.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

Knowledge, skills and abilities required:

- Efficient knowledge of telephone etiquette.
- Proficient in computer skills.
- Proficient in counting money; depositing funds and monetary reporting.
- Exceptional skills in customer relations/communication skills.
- Efficient knowledge of department forms, rules, procedures and guidelines.
- Exceptional skill in providing information and assistance to office staff, visitors and callers.

- High School Diploma, or GED Equivalent

Additional Certification:

- City of Woodville Approved Food Handlers Course (County Expense)

Additional Preferred Skills:

- Microsoft Suite (Excel, Word, and Outlook)

This position is a part-time job with the Tyler County Nutrition Center. The employee will report to and work under the Commissioners Court member as well as the program manager. The candidate must be able to lift, drive, and stand for long periods of time as part of normal daily functions. The candidate is expected to develop good working relationships with the community while on the job.
